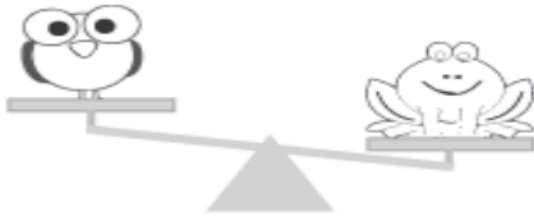

Mum and Dad said we were going on holiday to Devon. We packed lots of games to play in the car because we knew it would take a long time to get there.

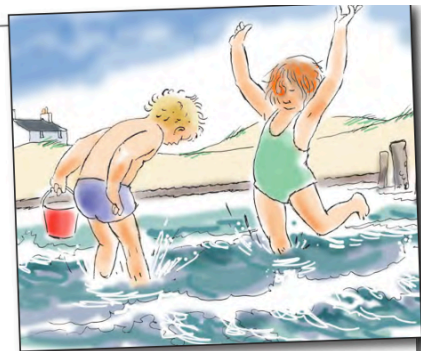
We stayed in a cottage so close to the beach that we could hear the sound of the waves crashing on the rocky shore.
