We would like you to find out what diverse means and write down the definition.

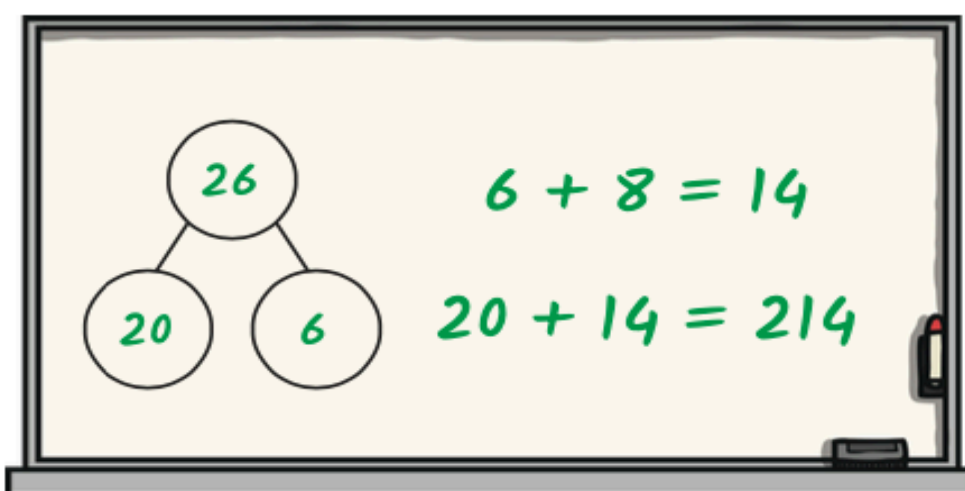
After you have done this, please write out **two** different sentences using our word of the week

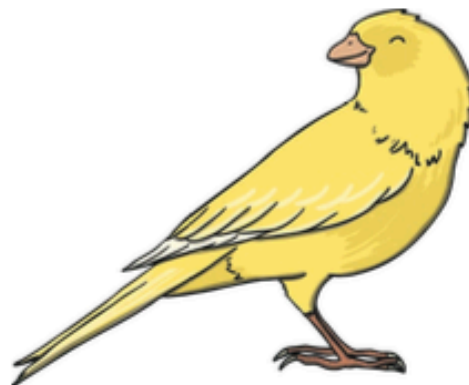

In the autumn of 1854, Mary left her home on the beautiful island of Jamaica and set sail across the Atlantic Ocean to London.

In London, Mary went to the War Office. She told them she was a good nurse and wanted to travel to Crimea to help the soldiers. Sadly they turned her down. However, Mary still wanted to go so she used her own money to travel to where the men were fighting.

When she arrived at Balaclava in Crimea, the doctors were very glad to see her. For many weeks, she worked from dawn until dusk

preparing food, mixing medicine and looking after patients. She risked her life many times during the battles.

By the end of the war, Mary had no money left but she was very proud of her work. When she got back to London she wrote a book called 'The Wonderful Adventures of Mrs Seacole in Many Lands'.

Mary's work had saved hundreds of lives and she was awarded many medals for her bravery but, sadly, she was never as famous as Florence Nightingale.
