





# How to Bake a Bun



Equipment: bowl, spoon, bun tin, paper bun cases, oven

### Ingredients:

100 grams self-raising flour 100 grams margarine 100 grams caster sugar 2 eggs 1 tablespoon of water

### Method:

- 1 Place all the ingredients into the bowl.
- 2 Mix the ingredients together until they turn creamy.
- 3 Place 12 bun cases in the bun tin.
- 4 Spoon the creamy mixture into the bun cases.
- 5 Place the bun tin in a hot oven for 10 to 15 minutes.
- 6 When the buns look golden brown, carefully lift them out of the oven and leave them to cool.
