
Reminder: Prepositions

A preposition is a word or group of words used before a noun, pronoun, or noun phrase to show direction, time, place, location, or to introduce an object.

Explore this winter scene of a playground and think about the actions, behaviours, emotions, feelings, and conversations that may be taking place as the children play.

Using your knowledge of prepositions, write a letter to Nana (Grand Mother) describing the scene, use lots of adjectives and details. Nana does not know the layout of the playground, or how Winter had affected the area, she also doesn't know the children of what they look like, so you will need to paint a picture with your words for her so she can visualise in her mind this exact scene.
