

Summer 1 -2 Curriculum Overview

KS1 YEAR 1&2 2022

Mathematics

For Maths, Key Stage 1 and 2 will be looking at different topics to cover for their Summer Term 1.

Year 1- Children will be looking at multiplication and division. Children will be examining counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. They will then be looking into making equal groups, making doubles followed by sharing activities.

Year 2- Children will learning about measurement such as measuring lengths, problems solving with

PE

For PE KS1 children will be focusing on fitness. Children will complete a scorecard allowing them to see the progress that they have made.

Children will learn how to change the direction of their movements, identify an activity they are good at, perform an underarm throw towards a target. KS1 children will also be able to identify similarities and differences between their own performance and that of someone else.

Topic: Transport in the Past

English

KS1 will be reading the book The Bear Under the Stairs. This will be a three-week planning sequence in which children use to as a model to write letters from the main character to the bear and back. KS1 children will write their own story of a child who fears something that might be in the house and will write a comparison between real bears and toy bears.

Islamic Link - In Islam we should only fear Allah and Allah alone. We should always remember Allah is there and will protect us. Importantly that Allah's mercy is greater this his wrath.

ART

For Art, KS1 will be reading the 'Colour Monster' book which explores the colours that are associated with feelings. We will be teaching that the colour black is not a bad colour.

Islamic Link- That although different colours may represent different emotions, but it does not determine a individual.

Science

For Science KS1 will be observing changes across the four seasons. Children will be able to describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies. Weather plays a big role in individuals to transport routines from walking to schools to flying out the country for holiday. Children in KS1 will also be looking at how transport is impacted by weather e.g., when it is foggy, planes cannot fly.

History

For history KS1 will be learning about 'The Wright Brothers'. We will be learning about why they are famous and how they managed to be the first to launch a man powered flight.

Islamic Link- Abbas ibn Firnas was the first human to fly and he was a Muslim.

PSHE

For KS1, children will be learning about acquiring the knowledge attitudes and interpersonal skills to help them understand and respect themselves. Students will learn how to make decisions, set goals, and take necessary actions to achieve their goals. Children will also learn about how to identify and express feelings and emotions as well as learn verses from the Quran and Sunnah that support the children's self-awareness.
